SESSION 1: OUTDOOR KITCHEN

DESIGN Outdoor kitchens play a key role in the retreats homeowners want. Drawing on the experience of outdoor kitchen professionals and homeowners, Andrew Hilger of Kalamazoo Outdoor Gourmet will present the key principles of designing outdoor kitchens to exceed clients' expectations

SESSION 2: OUTDOOR LIVING Robin Freeman looks at an emerging component in the single family market, outdoor living. Learn about seating and entertainment areas; what questions to ask when programming, how to lay them out, furnishings, upholsteries and lighting.

SESSION 3: AUDIO & VIDEO IN THE GARDEN: Tom Hall will be discussing basic principles about integrating electronic entertainment and control systems into outdoor spaces. He will provide a general overview of layout, components and wiring requirements. From this you should learn what is possible, what to watch out for and when to call in the specialists.

SESSION 4: HEAT IN THE GARDEN Mike Duvall and Scott Zaro will teach, in the context of outdoor "living" environments, about gas & electric radiant heaters along with gas & wood fireplaces and fire pits that bring warmth to your clients.

MINI SESSION: KIDS IN THE GARDEN Kids are a critical element to any project whether they are permanent residents or the occasional visitor. Tina Nyce, APLD will share photos to inspire creative ideas for kids outside.

SESSION 5: METAL & HARDWOODS

Cameron Scott will focus on recycled steel covering the many creative uses of metal in the garden, the advantages of the material, and how to install, bend, cut, and color steel to create unique and practical garden elements.

Patti Southard will discuss tropical wood species procurement and will compare the two major forest certification schemes to aid the designer in making informed decisions when specifying "certified" or sustainably harvested wood.

Pieter Sundgren explores the realms of tropical hardwoods and shows the characteristics of the many tropical hardwood species available. Installation & maintenance techniques that enable the design of outdoor uses will be discussed.

SESSION 6: WILDLIFE-FRIENDLY

GARDENING Emily Bishton will teach you about the tried-and-true plants, design techniques, and maintenance practices that will attract and nurture beneficial wildlife to live in a residential or commercial landscape. As a landscape designer, you are in a powerful position to dramatically impact the wildlife value of the "green corridors" in urban and suburban neighborhoods throughout this region.

MINI SESSION: THE DO'S & DON'TS

OF STEP DESIGN Lisa Port, APLD & Architect will discuss elements that comprise good stair design as well as touch on code, regulations, and safety issues we all must be aware of.
